Tell us one of your favorite memories from your time at GLA.

A few 5th grade students came running up to me with big smiles, giving me hugs and chatting like we'd just seen each other yesterday. Turns out, they were my former students from a previous school. That moment filled my heart, and ever since then, we've kept that connection—sharing hugs, quick conversations, and smiles each day. It reminded

me just how lasting the impact of our work can be, and how those bonds don't fade, no matter where we are.

Wide reading and small groups in ELA can definitely be challenging—there's so much planning, patience, and persistence involved. But I'll never forget the joy I felt when one of my students finally moved up a reading level. We had worked together for weeks in small group, practicing strategies, rereading texts, and building confidence step by step. When they saw their progress, their face lit up with pride—and in that moment, all the effort was worth it. Watching a student realize they can do it brings a kind of happiness that sticks with you.

What's your favorite memory from elementary/middle school?

My favorite moment in elementary school was when I was placed in a gifted/honors class, even though everyone around me was performing higher. Instead of giving up on me, my teacher leaned in—she gave me extra lessons and believed in me every step of the way. Long story short, when I took my standardized test, I grew three grade levels. I wish you could've seen the smile on my face—it was the moment I realized what I was capable of.


Spring Book Fair
