

PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

In conversations with parents, our leadership team is finding that many parents are unaware of some of the activities their children are engaging in online. Parents have identified it as a major area of concern for them and one of the greatest challenges of parenting in 2024.

As a parent of a kindergartener, I empathize with each of you. Supervision as a parent was hard enough before smartphones put the online world at all of our fingertips. Now our children have access to people and things online that are extraordinarily difficult to monitor. Humans are built to be social and emotionally connected and accountable to each other. The veil of the internet provides a degree of separation from connection and accountability to others that leads many people to behave in ways they would not in an in-person social setting. Children, who are still developing a wide array of cognitive functioning skills, are especially vulnerable to temptation online and susceptible to engaging with others in inappropriate ways (e.g. conflict, bullying, sexually).

Whether your child has a smartphone or other device, it is important that parents take steps to limit and monitor the internet and social media use of their child(ren). Compared to a decade ago, I am astounded at the number of discipline issues our school's staff and administration deal with that have a direct or indirect connection to students' online activities <u>outside of school</u>. Whether it is a younger student mimicking behavior they have seen in a Tik Tok video or a group of middle school students having conflict over a group chat from the weekend, dealing with behavior related to unmonitored online activity has occupied more time of school staff than we would like.

We need your support, and more importantly, your child needs your support. Please consider how you are monitoring your child's activity at home. I have included a couple resources that show how you can set parental controls on devices at home:
