## **Title IX Training**

CPS District's Office of Student Protection and Title IX's commitment to this endeavor includes providing training on preventing and reporting abuse to all Pre-K-12 CPS students. The Office of Student Protection and Title IX (OSP) Sexual Misconduct, Title IX, and Bias-based Behavior Student Training covers the following five learning objectives using developmentally appropriate language:

- 1. Students will understand CPS Title IX Policy and Discrimination Statement.
- 2. Students will know who the Title IX Coordinator is, what OSP does, and how to contact OSP.
- 3. Students will understand what constitutes sexual harassment and bias-based harm.
- 4. Students will be aware of the resources available to students who report sexual harassment, retaliation, or bias-based harm, including supportive measures pending an investigation.
- 5. Students will know what to do if they believe they or other students have been subjected to sexual harassment or bias-based harm.

The sessions, which are all around 30 minutes long and broken down by grade, will take place on **Tuesday**, **November 19th**, during students' morning meetings or advisory. Parents can opt out of the Title IX Student Training. <u>Today</u>, <u>Title IX Forms were sent home with all students</u>. If you opt your child out, please return the <u>attached form to the Office or Ms. Melissa</u>.
