# **NEW ANNOUNCEMENTS**

#### Middle School Sexual Education

Great Lakes Academy will start its sexual education curriculum this week Wednesday, January 8th for grades 5-8th. If you would like to opt your scholar out of this course please contact Coach P (tperez@glachicago.org). Scholars will be sent home with a subject letter on Tuesday, January 7th that will outline all topics covered. No communication is required for your scholar to be opted in.

#### Middle School Yondr Pouch Policy

This is a reminder that all 5th - 8th-grade scholars must use a Yondr pouch if they bring a cell phone or other technology to school. Each scholar received a Yondr pouch at the start of the school year. If your scholar no longer has their pouch, please do not allow them to bring their device to school. Bringing a device without an operable Yondr pouch will result in a referral.

Reading Incentive: Book Vending Machines

GLA's Book Vending Machines are in full swing! The book vending machines are an incentive to celebrate students who are meeting or exceeding their Step and iReady goals for reading.

For students to participate they must earn 150 steps (K-4) or 14 passed iReady lessons (K-8). This is a continuous process so students also earn the token after 300 steps, 28 lessons, etc. ELA teachers award students meeting these requirements weekly with a reading ticket. Students redeem these tickets for a token and choose a book from the machine in the cafeteria or the link.

Students in K-4 who reach their Step goals are engaging in a wide range of reading both in and outside of school. Engaging in this wide range of reading is critical for students to develop the wide range of context and practice it takes to continually improve their reading skills and become critical readers. If students are staying on pace with their Step goals, they should receive a token around every 1.5 months.

For K-8 students, iReady is a program that supports students in developing their reading skills via an individualized, targeted pathway. iReady suggests that students who pass 2 or more lessons a week are significantly more likely to reach their reading goals. If students are staying on pace with their iReady lessons, they should receive a token around once every 1.5 months.

Students are loving their new books. We hope that this program encourages students to keep making progress with their academic ELA goals and continues to grow their love for reading.

Come out and enjoy a night of fitness fun with your scholar! This two hour event is a great way to get moving and engage with the GLA community. We welcome all fitness levels to join us!


