Welcome to all our newest Fort Collins Figure Skating Club Members! If you are new here, TESTING, is a term that we use all the time that comprises the official US Figure Skating process for moving up in a skater's skill level. Our club hosts about 9 official "Test Sessions" a year and you may see emails from the club about registering for these. These test sessions are specifically for higher level (not learn to skate) skaters who are working with a private coach and are ready to take a skating skills or free skate test in front of official judges. If your skater is ready to begin private lessons with a skating coach, please feel free to reach out to our club at fcfigureskating@gmail.com and we can help guide you in the process. EPIC Productions

EPIC Productions Gets Underway for the 2023 Season

The FCFSC national showcase group EPIC Productions is underway preparing for an exciting 2023 performance season. The 19-skater group started rehearsals in February with an innovative team-building exercise designed by parent volunteer Maria Miller. The exercise, a scavenger hunt around Old Town, helped reveal the big news that the skaters had been eagerly waiting for: EPIC Productions will perform an excerpt from the Broadway musical Suessical, complete with the Cat in the Hat, Gertrude McFuzz, the Grinch, and even a Sour Kangaroo! EPIC Productions will travel with coaches Marianne Strobel and Denaysa Sisemore to Boston, Massachusetts this August to compete.

At the end of February, the coaches also announced themes and casting for the three mini-ensembles – smaller groups of 5 to 8 skaters that perform a 2:30 to 3:30 minute number. This season's mini-ensembles include seven of the Greek muses from the animated film Hercules, schoolchildren from Matilda the Broadway show singing



about being "Revolting Children," and a gang of pirates from Peter Pan. We can't wait to see them put on their eye-patches and swashbuckle across the ice!

The 19-skater group rehearses weekly to develop theatrical and skating skills throughout the season, like learning how to skate in blocks, coordinate an axel, and slide on their knees across the ice. Elaborate costumes and set pieces created by parent and skater volunteers give the ensembles the flare they need to embody each different character. Skaters help out as Team Captains and Coordinators for costumes, make-up, promotions, and events.

In the coming months, the group will put on fun activities to raise money for travel, costumes, and props, including a skate-a-thon, a garage sale, and more, coordinated by parent volunteer Alison Coatman. We hope you can help out!

In Memoriam

Sadly, on February 21, 2023, FCFSC lost one of our long-time members and the father of Coach Susan Geiser. Kenneth Miller of Fort Collins passed away at the age of 94.

Ken began skating at a young age using tie on blades over his shoes. He learned how to ice skate in high school, skating on local ponds. After retirement, Ken, age 57, began taking private lessons. Age 60 he started competitive figure skating, which became his serious athletic past-time for twenty-one years. He skated in one-hundred sixteen events. 92 gold medals help comprise Ken's awards collection he'd earned in this sport. At 80, he skated in an International World Event (his last) and won 2 more medals.

Ken skated to the song Kenny Rogers "Though the Years" for his wife for their 50th, 60th and 70th Anniversaries. He was named Fort Collins Recreator of the Year in 2018; you might notice his photo for this in against the boards in the blue rink.

Knee replacement slowed him down, but he laced up weekly and skated at EPIC in Fort Collins until recently.

He was more than an amazing person; he was an inspiration to many people. Ken was always a high achiever at everything he did. His energy, dedication and passion throughout his life have touched many lives.

A celebration of life will be held on Saturday, March 25th 2023 at 10:00 AM at the First United Methodist Church (1005 Stover St, Fort Collins, CO 80524).
