I. COMPETITION OVERVIEW

The Fort Collins Classic will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the <u>current rulebook</u>, and/or current Compete USA handbook as well as any pertinent updates that have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating <u>website</u>.

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules.

Skaters must be a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, Learn to Skate USA[®] member, a collegiate club or who is an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. For non-U.S. citizens, please refer to the <u>rulebook</u> for more information.

Registration is on EMS and will be open from February 12 to 9:59pm MST March 1, 2024 with late entries accepted through 9:59pm MST March 8, 2024 with a \$60 late fee.

*First event charge includes a mandatory \$15 video fee and a \$5 hospitality fee. In return, all skaters will be emailed videos of their events following the completion of the competition.

II. ELIGIBILITY

Singles: Excel and Well-Balanced Events:

- Skaters must meet at least the minimum singles test requirements for the event's level. A skater's singles test level may be higher than the minimum requirement.
 - Skate Up: skaters may skate up one level higher than their minimum test requirement allows.
- Skaters may not register for an event level lower than allowed by their competitive floor. An athlete's competitive floor is set by one of the following scenarios:
 - If an athlete has a paid EMS series application for the NQS series, the event level registered for in the most recent NQS will become the lowest level they may compete at in any U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned event.
 - If an athlete has a paid EMS series application for the Excel Series, the event level registered for in the most recent Excel series will become the lowest level they may compete in any Excel event. For Well-Balanced and Specialty events the skater will be permitted to register at one level lower than the "floor" set by their excel series entry.
 - If an athlete has never had a paid EMS series application in the NQS or Excel series, the athlete may select their level based on their goals and technical skills as long as the minimum test requirements are met.
- Skaters are not permitted to enter an Excel free skate and a Well-Balanced free skate event at the same competition (example: Juvenile Girls Free Skate and Juvenile Girls Excel Free Skate). However, they are permitted to enter an Excel and a Well-Balanced event of different types such as a short program (if stand-alone event option), specialty or showcase events (example: Intermediate Women Short Program and Intermediate Women Excel Free Skate).

All other singles and partner events (such as Adults, Pairs, Ice Dance):

- Skaters must meet the minimum test requirements for the events level, but not exceed the maximum permissible test requirement.

Synchronized Skating:

• For synchronized skating teams, this competition is not requiring that skating skills test requirements for the team's level be met, except for the maximum allowed at the Compete USA levels (Snowplow Sam Synchro and Aspire levels).

COACHES

To be an eligible coach at a nonqualifying competition, coaches must meet the applicable compliance requirements and verified by U.S. Figure Skating. Coach compliance falls into two categories, Coach Compliance (includes choreographers) and Learn to Skate USA® Instructor Compliance. Details regarding compliance requirements can be found <u>HERE</u>. All compliance requirements must be met at the time of check-in to access the competition, no exceptions.

<u>Coaches of foreign athletes:</u> If you are a coach of a foreign athlete only, you are not subject to U.S. Figure Skating coach compliance and will only be asked to provide a letter of good standing for the federation your athlete represents.

With EMS, coaches must be included within a skater/team's registration or updated through their EMS Skater Portal via "<u>My Coaches</u>" or "Team Personnel." All coaches declared at the time of registration will be included on the registration confirmation email. Note: There is no registration approval process within EMS as the data (membership and test level) is tied to the U.S. Figure Skating database. Non-compliant coaches will receive automated email reminders through the start of the competition.

TEAM SERVICE PERSONNEL

Teams are permitted a maximum of two team service personnel. Team service personnel must have a current U.S. Figure Skating membership, a green lighted background check and completed SafeSport[™] Training. All compliance requirements must be met at the time of check-in to access the competition, no exceptions. Team service personnel is defined as those indicated as a team manager and/or team service personnel planning to attend the competition with the team.

All team personnel and skaters who will need to receive a credential must be listed in the Team Portal for the competition (Team Personnel for coaches and team managers; Competition Roster for skaters and alternates). In order to be added in EMS, the individual must first be added in the team's profile through Member's Only.

MANDATORY ATHLETES

Athletes age 18+ as of the competition start date who will be competing on a team (i.e., synchro, ice dance, pairs, shadow dance, theatre, etc.) with at least one Minor Athlete must complete SafeSport[™] Training. *

Minor athletes who turn 18 mid-season are encouraged to seek parental consent to take the online SafeSport[™] Training early to avoid any disruptions in their ability to participate as the training is required upon turning 18. The athlete will not be compliant until they have completed the training and their Members Only portal reflects completion. Please email <u>skatesafe@usfigureskating.org</u> for instructions or questions regarding parental consent.

III. REGISTRATION INFORMATION

ONLINE REGISTRATION VIA EMS (does not include SYS and TOI team registration):

Online registrations will be accepted via <u>EMS</u>. Payment must be made at the time of registration by <u>credit card only</u>. Each transaction includes a 3% transaction fee and a \$20 Video/hospitality fee. This fee will ensure that each competitor/team will receive a video of each performance emailed to them following the conclusion of the competition.

PARTNERED EVENTS:

Only one partner will complete registration for the team. During the registration process, you will be asked to identify your partner and verify their test information. The registered partner will be responsible for managing all aspects of the competition for the team including music/PPC upload, practice ice sales, etc.

FOREIGN SKATERS:

Non-U.S. skaters intending to register for this competition must set up a non-member account prior to registering for the competition (<u>click here for HOW TO</u>). This can be done by choosing the "Non-Member? Create Account" option on the <u>Members Only</u> login page.

ONLINE REGISTRATION VIA EMS (Synchro Teams only):

All teams are required to register online via the U.S. Figure Skating Event Management System (EMS). Anyone listed as a team manager or coach for a team in their Members Only Team Profile will be able to access the registration system. Registration for the competition is not considered final until online payment has been received. Online payment via credit card is the only form of accepted payment for registration in EMS.

- 1. Go to <u>https://m.usfigureskating.org</u>.
- 2. Use your personal member number and password to login.
- 3. Click the **BLUE** "EMS Event Management System" button.
- 4. Choose "Competition Registration Teams" from the menu.
- 5. Select the team you would like to register for competition.
- 6. Click the REGISTER NOW button next to your competition's name.

NOTE: Only the competitions for which your team(s) are eligible will appear.

- 7. Walk through the on-screen registration process which will include:
 - a. <u>Team Verification</u>: Confirm the team's information is accurate.
 - b. <u>Registration Overview</u>: Review general information about the competition.
 - c. <u>Event Selection</u>: Confirm the event you are registering the team for is accurate.
 - d. <u>Competition Roster Selection</u>: Click the "Add Skaters" link. The screen will display all skaters listed in your Main Roster. Check the box next to each skater's name to add them to the competition roster.
 - e. <u>Coach Information</u>: Click the "**Add Coaches**" link. The screen will display all coaches listed in your Team Profile. Check the box next to each coach's name to add them. Only the coaches who will be attending this competition should be listed. This information can also be updated from your EMS Team Portal. You will only be able to add coaches who are listed in your Team Profile.
 - f. <u>Team Service Personnel Information</u>: Click the "Add Team Service Personnel" to add attending team service personnel. The screen will display team managers and team service personnel listed in your Team Profile. Check the box next to each name to add them. Only the team service personnel who will be attending this competition should be listed. This information can also be updated from your EMS Team Portal. You will only be able to add team service personnel who are listed in your Team Profile.

8. Payment via credit card will be required to complete your registration as it is the only accepted form of payment for registration in EMS. Registrations are not considered complete until an invoice confirmation via email has been received. A 3% processing fee will be assessed at check-out.

NOTE: Payment must be submitted individually for each team's registration. If you are planning on registering multiple teams in a short period of time, it is recommended that you contact your credit card company to prevent anti-fraud systems from being activated.

FOREIGN SYNCHRO AND THEATRE ON ICE TEAMS:

TEST CREDIT:

Skaters requesting test credit must select the option "Test Credit" during registration or through "Add Event" process within EMS. Late requests can be accommodated until April 1, 2024 by making a request via email <u>gayleen.carpenter@gmail.com</u> where the payment must be completed online via EMS prior to receiving a credential and competing. Skaters can pick up their completed test credit packet from the Registration/Check-in desk approx.

CRITIQUES/FEEDBACK

Critiques will be offered free of charge to all skaters in levels Juvenile and above.

MUSIC SUBMISSION/UPLOAD:

EMS MUSIC UPLOAD: Competitors participating in events with music are required to upload their music to EMS no later than **3/24/2024 9:59 MST**. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature and subject to a **\$25 late fee**. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite. Competitors must also have available a backup copy of their competition music on a cell phone and it must be immediately available rinkside whenever the skater competes. If the phone does not have the standard round headset connector, an appropriate adapter, such as an Apple Lightning connector or Samsung USB-C adapter is required to be attached. The phone should be presented to the music person with the file ready to play, phone in airplane mode and volume turned to maximum.

PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT (PPC) SUBMISSION/UPLOAD - FOR IJS EVENTS ONLY:

EMS PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT (PPC) – Competitors participating in IJS events are required to submit PPC in EMS no later than **3/24/2024 9:59 MST**. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature in EMS and subject to a **\$25 late fee**. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

IV. COMPETITION DETAILS

FACILITIES:

Edora Pool Ice Center (EPIC) 1801 Riverside Avenue, Fort Collins, CO 80525 https://www.fcgov.com/recreation/epic EPIC has two NHL size ice surfaces. The judges will sit on a platform across from the stands on the east side of the rink. There is not a snack bar on the premises but there will be vendors selling concessions.

LOCKER ROOM AND CHANGING AREAS:

GENERAL LOCKER ROOMS:

Locker rooms and changing areas will not be available for this competition. All athletes are expected to arrive at the arena ready (costumes, hair, make-up, etc.). Athletes will be provided with an area to put skates on but changing will not be permitted in these areas.

SYNCHRO TEAM LOCKER ROOM):

The designated team coach, team manager, team service personnel and athletes competing at the skating event are allowed in the Locker Rooms/Changing Area designated for their team. The team coach, team manager, and team service personnel should remove themselves from the Locker Room/Changing Area while any Minor Athlete(s) are actively changing or undressing. All Locker Rooms/Changing Areas will be monitored. If any concerns arise, immediately contact the Locker Room/Changing Area monitor. If there are concerns regarding this policy, an athlete should change prior to arriving at the competition. The use of any recording and photographic devices inside a Locker Room/Changing Area is strictly prohibited. Any violation of this policy is punishable under the U.S. Figure Skating SkateSafe® policy and U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

U.S. Figure Skating Travel Policy:

All travel must strictly adhere to Two-Deep Leadership requirements. An Adult Participant cannot transport a Minor Athlete one-on-one and Two-Deep Leadership requirements must be adhered to at all

times during In-Program travel, by transporting at least two minors or a second Adult Participant. An Adult Participant cannot share a hotel room or other sleeping arrangement with a Minor Athlete(s). Full details of the SkateSafe® Travel Policy and any exceptions can be found starting on page 12 of the <u>SkateSafe® Handbook</u>.

OFFICIAL WEBSITE & UPDATES:

It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent and coach to check the Website <u>https://www.fortcollinsfsc.org/fort-collins-classic/</u> frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information pertaining to the competition. An online program and links to live scoring will be provided on the web link.

SCHEDULE

Competitors may be scheduled on any day or time during the announced dates of the competition. The competition and practice ice schedule will be available after the close of entries. All participants will be notified via email once available.

PRACTICE ICE:

Unofficial Practice Ice (UPI) will begin on Thursday, April 4th, 2024. UPI sessions will be offered for all Free Skate, Short Program, and Artistic Events. Skater music will not be played. There is a maximum of 1 UPI session per skater, per eligible event. UPI will be 30 minutes in length and may or may not take place on the competition ice surface. Assigned UPI is non-refundable. Warm up PI will not be available. Props are not allowed on practice ice sessions. Compete USA Practice Ice is 15 minutes in length. Eligible events are Free Skate, Compulsory, and Artistic Events. Skater music will not be played. Compete USA PI will begin on April 3rd, 2024.

We reserve the right to cancel or change any practice ice session. Practice ice will be selected by the competitor. After the close of entries, you will receive an email from the LOC through EMS letting you know when practice ice selection is available. Practice ice is not refundable after the close of entries on March 1, 2024. If you have issues with practice ice the day the competition starts or at the competition, please do not call or email. Please see the practice ice table. We will do our best to limit Practice Ice sessions based on the following guidelines, however, may adjust these limits given scheduling constraints as determined by the Chief Referee. • Singles Sessions: no more than 12 athletes

Pre-Purchase: Practice ice credits may be purchased after participants complete their event registration, via the EMS Competition Portal. Skaters who purchase credits during the pre-purchase period will be able to select sessions during the selection period, after the schedule has been completed and posted.

AWARDS:

Pick up and/or presentation of awards will immediately follow the posting of results electronically. Awards will be given to 1st through 4th place skaters except for Compete USA events, for which an award will be given to all participants.

VOLUNTEER INFO:

Volunteer Compliance: Reminder: compliant positions at all U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned events include key LOC members, locker room monitors and ALL medical event personnel. To be considered compliant, an approved volunteer serving in one of these positions must: \checkmark Must submit information for, proper payment of \$30 and successfully pass a background check. The background check will be valid for two seasons, the one in which it was completed plus one additional \checkmark Must complete annual SafeSport Training. The training will be valid for 365 days from date of completion and there is no cost for the training/certification.

VOLUNTEER COMPLIANCE:

Reminder: Compliant positions at all U.S. Figure Skating events include LOC leadership, locker room monitors and <u>emergency</u> medical providers .

MISSION STATEMENT: To provide an opportunity for Colorado skaters to develop their skating skills in a fun, competitive environment.

AWARDS: During the competition season, skaters and teams/clubs will have the chance to compete at 10 different competitions and earn points for a final standing. <u>Trophies and medals will</u> <u>be awarded at the Skate Colorado Compete USA competition at the 2024 Colorado Springs</u> Invitational.

Skate Colorado Compete USA Series Team Banner (3x4) – 1^s, 2st, and 3st place banners will be awarded to the club/skating school with the most points scored throughout the entire series (all 10 competitions) by skaters representing that club/skating school (points for clubs and skating schools located at the same rink will be added together to enhance and create more of a "team" concept). Points will be awarded based upon the same system as the individual points. Only the top 10 team members' OVERALL scores FOR THE ENTIRE SEASON (including move up points) will count toward the team points for the determination of the team trophy. Tie breakers will be the same as the individual tie breakers.

Free Skate Program and Elements/Compulsory Series Point System

A skater must enter BOTH the Free skate Program AND the Elements/Compulsory event <u>IN THE</u> <u>SAME LEVEL</u> in each of at least TWO (2) of the 10 registered Skate Colorado Compete USA Competitions to be eligible for accumulating points. Skaters must compete in a minimum of TWO (2) competitions. Only up to the best 4 scores (free skate and compulsory/elements added together) of the season will be totaled for the final score in the series. Each event will have a maximum of six skaters. Both youth and adults may accumulate points!

The system for scoring points for the trophies will be as follows:

1st place 2nd place

3rd place

4th place

5th place

* A skater will earn three points toward their overall standing each time the skaters competes in a level that is higher than the level competed in at the previous competition throughout the duration of the series. In order to keep the extra three points he/she must compete in that level or higher in all subsequent competitions. Move up points will be awarded for events 2-9 in the series (even though the event point scores may not be one of the final four best scores).

In the event that there is only one skater in an event, the skater will have the choice to skate alone OR move up a level to compete against other skaters, HOWEVER, THE SKATER WILL HAVE TO MOVE UP IN BOTH THE ELEMENTS/COMPULSORY MOVES AND THE PROGRAMS W/MUSIC EVENTS. In this case, those skaters will be allowed to move back to their original level to compete at the next competition and shall not be awarded the 3 point move up credit.

If an event has 2-6 skaters, the points will be awarded as if there were six skaters in the group. If there is only one skater in the group, that skater will be awarded three points.

In case of a tie, the total number of skaters that the competitor has skated against throughout the series (all competitions and not just the competitions with the 4 best scores) will be the 1st tie breaker. The total score for all free skate events during the season will be the 2nd tie breaker, the total score for all compulsory events during the season will be the 3rd tie breaker, and the number of levels increased throughout the season will be the 4th tie breaker.

All points follow the skater throughout the series, so if a skater moves up to higher levels, the points follow the skater. Once a skater moves up a level, they may not compete at a lower level unless they moved up as a result of having no other skaters in their group.

Trophies will be awarded 1-3 in each level from Snowplow Sam through Free Skate 6 and Adult 1-6. The trophies will be awarded to the skaters at their level as of the last competition in which they compete.

Rules and Format:

COMPETITION ANNOUNCEMENT

The Skate Colorado Compete USA Series is sponsored equally by the 10 participating ice rinks and/or U.S. Figure Skating member clubs. Competition packages will be available at all participating ice rinks and/or via the club or rink websites. Each competition will have its own entry forms and specific rules so please make sure to read the entire announcement for each competition.

ELIGIBILITY RULES FOR PARTICIPANTS

The competition is open to ALL skaters who are current eligible (ER 1.00) members of either the Learn to Skate USA Program and/or are full members of U.S. Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete but must be registered with the host Learn to Skate USA Program/Club or any other Learn to Skate USA Program/Club. Eligibility will be based on skill level as of the closing date of entries.

All Snowplow Sam through Basic 6 skaters are eligible to skate at highest level passed OR one level higher BUT not both levels in the same event during the same competition and NO official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed including MIF or individual dances.

All Aspire 1 - 4 may compete at the level that best fits their skill level and may NOT have passed the USFS Preliminary Singles test.

It is very important to the success of the series that skaters are placed in the correct divisions. If, for whatever reason, the local organizing committee and/or their Chief Referee discover that a skater has been placed in a category that is below their class level, the chair and referee will have the option to move the skater to the proper division, even if this has to be done the day of the competition. This will ensure that every event is as fair as possible to the competitors.

Elements: Snowplow Sam – Basic 6

Format: Each skater will perform one element at a time (in program format) in the <u>order listed</u> <u>below</u> (no excessive connecting steps or choreography)

- To be skated on ¹/₂ ice, no music
- All elements must be skated in the order listed no additional elements are allowed
- The skater <u>must demonstrate</u> the required elements as described
- Each element may only be attempted once
- Time: 1:00 MAX

Compulsory: Aspire 1-4 and Adults 1-6

Format: In program format, using a <u>limited number</u> of connecting steps, the skating order of the required elements is optional

- To be skated on ¹/₂ ice, no music
- Each element may only be attempted once
- May use any additional elements from <u>previous</u> levels as connecting steps.
- A .2 deduction will be taken for each element missing, repeated or from a higher level
- Time: 1:15 MAX Pre-Free Skate Free Skate 6; 1:30 MAX Adult 1-6

Programs with Music: Snowplow Sam – Basic 6

Format: The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times the element is executed or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc. unless otherwise specified.

To be skated on full ice with music

• The skater <u>must demonstrate</u> the required elements as described and may use any additional elements from their current level or a previous level

• If the description of a required move states the direction of the element or the placement of the free leg, then options are \underline{NOT} allowed

- A .2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level
- · Bonus skills from the same level or below are allowed but will NOT be judged elements
- Time: 1:10 MAX

Programs with Music: Adult 1 – 6

Format: The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times element is executed, or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc. unless otherwise stated. Connecting steps and transitions should be demonstrated throughout the program.

- Vocal music is allowed.

• The skater <u>must demonstrate</u> the required elements as described and may use, but is not required to use, any additional elements from their current level or a previous level

- A .2 deduction will be taken for each element missing, repeated or from a higher level
