Of all responsibilities as Executive Director of the Healing Bridge Clinic, one of my favorite things to do is write our annual report. Our annual report summarizes our activities, achievements, and financial performance over the past year, providing transparency to deepen our community trust. It's a favorite because I get to brag on our staff, board, volunteers, partners, and supporters, and, with the success of our FY25, there is a lot to brag about.

We expanded our staff for the first time in three years by adding a Certified Medical Assistant. Domenica Brown brings a lot to our team, and we are beyond blessed to have her with us. Our board saw transition with two long-term members reaching their term limit. Our volunteer team grew to its largest size in our history, and that team of talented, big-hearted people provided more volunteer hours than we have ever recorded.

Our incredible volunteer provider team continued to grow as new services were added. We launched a new idea for annual sponsorships. Annual sponsors get access to all our fundraising events and in return we provide them with marketing shoutouts, visibility of their logo on key HBC communications, and special social media postings of their businesses. We were honored by the response of this new, innovative idea and we want to thank **City of Hope – Atlanta, QTS Data Centers, Steven Newton Law, Piedmont Fayette Hospital, Resurgens Orthopaedics, and Stride Anew LLC** for being inaugural annual sponsors.

We continued making strides in the social media arena with a video from our golf tournament going viral with over 3.3 million views and increasing our followers by over 700!

We brought the power of our services to life, with several patient stories and learned that when patients tell their HBC stories, even we learn how much life-change is taking place.

Financially, we saw our general giving drop, however, this decrease was expected because of our capital campaign. Overall, we were good stewards of your support and ended FY25 with 83% of our capital campaign goal received. **We reached the 83% mark in less than 20 months and could possibly reach our \$1,000,017 goal in 24 months!**

As we look ahead, we are excited about what is in store for FY26. Our strategic plan has bold goals in increasing our fundraising, our awareness, and services.

As we navigate the days ahead, we know God has a hand in all that we do. We also know that the goals we reach, the accomplishments we make, and the impact we have are only possible because of our volunteers, community partners, and those who believe enough in our mission to support our work.

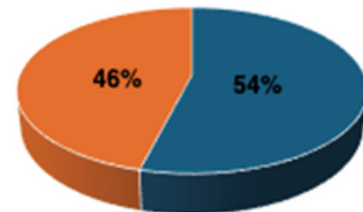
FY25 BY THE NUMBERS

In addition to the **\$2,720,000** in services provided, an increase of 60% over the previous year, we are happy to report increases in each of the following categories:
