
### **FUN FACT:**

### Creator of the World Wide Web

Berners-Lee, an average British computer scientist was the originator of the World Wide Web. In the late 1980s, he proposed a project that combined hypertext (the system that allows you to click on links and open other webpages) and the internet. His goal was to allow researchers a place to share information online so that others could see it any time of the day. The end result was the World Wide Web we know and rely on today. He was knighted by


