2023 CoC Program Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) Released

Read the NOFO

On July 5, 2023, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) officially posted the **Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)** for FY2023 Continuum of Care Competition on Grants.gov.

For FY23, Northern Colorado (CO-505) has an annual renewal demand (ARD) of \$1,419,359, plus roughly \$99,000 in CoC Bonus and \$113,000 in DV Bonus Funds for

renewal, new and/or expanded eligible projects.

NoCO CoC Program Competition Information

Available Funding

- Tier 1 - \$1,320,004 or 93% of Annual Renewal Demand (ARD)
- Tier 2 - Remaining 7% of ARD + CoC Bonus Funds* ~\$99,000, Reallocated Funds
- DV Bonus Funds* - ~\$113,463

*CoC Bonus and DV Bonus Funds are very competitive; these funds can be used for eligible new and expansion projects. Final available amounts of CoC Bonus and DV Bonus funds available have not yet been released by HUD.

Competition Timeline

The Northern Colorado 2023 CoC Program Competition will run on the following timeline:

- **7/27/23 - Notice of Intent to Apply Due:** Renewal and New Projects must submit a completed Intent to Apply form by 5pm to be eligible to receive a Project Rating Application
- **8/18/23 - Completed Project Rating Applications are due** to the CoC Project Rating Committee
- **9/8/23 - Notification of Project Approval and Rank or Project Rejection:** Projects approved and ranked by the Project Rating Committee will be allowed to submit a Project Application in eSnaps; Rejected Applications may appeal the decision for grounds by 9/13/23.
- **9/22/23 - Completed Project Applications due in eSnaps** for CoC Final Review
- **9/28/23 - CoC Consolidated Application due to HUD**

Notice of Intent to Apply Guidelines

Organizations interested in applying for *Renewal* or *New* CoC Program projects **complete the Intent to Apply form by 5pm on 7/27/23** to be eligible to receive a Project Rating Application.
