NoCO CoC Releases New Reports



2024 Northern Colorado State of Homelessness Report

Having only officially formed as a CoC in January of 2020, this is the first time the NoCO CoC has released a comprehensive State of Homelessness Report. The intention of the report is to provide CoC partners and the community at large with a depth of information related to the state of homelessness in Northern Colorado, data analysis and system performance information, current efforts to address homelessness, gaps, and challenges and future directions.





2024 NoCO CoC Point in Time & Housing Inventory Count Report

The 2024 Point in Time (PIT) and Housing Inventory Count (HIC) occurred on January 30. This newly released report takes a deeper look into the PIT and HIC data collected this year to better understand overall trends in homelessness over time, disparity analysis, and tracking of availability and utilization of housing resources.



HUD Announces CoCBuilds Special NOFO

The Continuum of Care (CoC) Builds (CoCBuilds) NOFO targets efforts within CoC geographic areas to address and reduce persons experiencing homelessness by adding new units of permanent supportive housing (PSH) through new construction, acquisition, or rehabilitation through one-time CoCBuilds awards under the CoC Program. Through the CoCBuilds NOFO, HUD is encouraging CoCs to leverage funds provided for construction, acquisition, or rehabilitation of new PSH units with other funding sources to maximize the amount of housing that can directed to meeting the needs of individuals and families experiencing homelessness. PSH is permanent housing in which supportive services are provided to assist individuals with a disability and families where at least one household member has a disability and is experiencing homelessness to live independently.

CoCBuilds Consolidated Applications are due to HUD November 21, 2024.

Homeless Contribution Tax Credit: Information Session



Your Program May Qualify for the Colorado Homeless Contribution Income Tax Credit The Colorado Homeless Contribution Income Tax Credit (HCTC) provides a tax credit to Colorado taxpayers that contribute to eligible homelessness-related projects within Colorado. When taxpayers make a certified contribution, they can claim 25% (for non-rural projects) or 30% (for rural projects) of their donation of \$100 or more, potentially motivating donors to contribute more to your organization!

Nonprofit organizations submit an application to the Division of Housing to determine eligibility. Qualifying organizations must have services within the state of Colorado with the primary focus on assisting those experiencing homelessness or, in the case of prevention, those facing imminent risk of homelessness.

Coordinated Assessment Housing Placement System (CAHPS)

CAHPS is the community-driven process to identify, assess, refer, and house all people experiencing homelessness in Weld and Larimer Counties.

Since 2016, the CAHPS process has helped house 2,007 households.

Through CAHPS, the NoCO CoC is participating in the <u>Community</u> <u>Solutions Built for Zero Initiative</u> to reach Functional Zero to end Veteran and Chronic homelessness.
