# WHO **WE ARE**



Call this the prom without prejudice INCLUSION: Event aimed

at LGBT youth promotes fun, minus the judgments

ALSO Youth was founded in 1992 by community members concerned by the high rates of suicide among LGBTQ+ youth. In cooperation with local organizations such as PFLAG, Planned Parenthood, and YMCA Youth and Family Services, volunteers were recruited to conduct a support group for Sarasota Youth.

After moving between several temporary youth centers, we moved into our Sarasota Youth Center in 2004.



Our programs and services have evolved over the years to support our community's most relevant needs.

- 2014 and in 2015, we launched an annual alternative prom and introduced annual scholarships for LGBTQ+ youth looking to continue their education.
- 2020, we merged with an organization in Manatee County, called PRISM Youth Initiative, expanding our area of service.
- 2021, ALSO Youth introduced ALSO, Jr. in response to an increased demand from families for programs for youth 10 to 12 years-old.
- January 2023, ALSO Youth opened our permanent Manatee County Youth Center to better establish our reach of programs and services.

We are looking forward to meeting the widening needs of the LGBTQ+ youth in our community for years to come.



### WHAT WE DO

ALSO Youth works to create a space where kids and young adults receive a multi-dimensional approach to their wellbeing. Our efforts focus on three connected areas to help make LGBTQ+ youth feel healthy and safe.





### **HEALTH & WELLNESS**

Youth continue to report difficulty with concentration, low self-esteem, and feelings of loneliness and isolation. Our mental health services were introduced in 2022 in response to concerns about LGBTQ+ youth suicide, discrimination, and emotional turbulence. In 2024, we provided over 800 therapy sessions.

Our services include a weekly parent support group and mental health counseling sessions for youth and families, scheduled at their convenience, whether in person or virtually. We approach these services clinically, utilizing licensed and trained mental health counselors who can successfully address LGBTQ+ issues.



All of our mental health services are provided **free of charge** <u>to</u> <u>participants, and we invest an</u> <u>average of \$6000</u> each month for this critical program.

## YOUTH EMPOWERMENT

We provide five days of engaging, educational, and diverse programs each week between our two youth centers. Our centers are safe spaces for LGBTQ+ youth and their allies to find community, build friendships, and receive support to navigate the challenges of adolescence.

Programs are created and implemented in response to the needs of the youth in our community. Attendance at program activities averages 115 each month.

Our frequent program events include:

- Gender Identity Peer Support Group
- Disabled Youth Program
- ALSO, Jr. for Ages 10-12
- Rainbow Book Club
- Annual Scholarships
- Youth Leadership Program
- Summer/Spring Day Camps
- Diversity & Inclusivity Training
- Community Field Trips
- Young Adult Night





\$43.51/youth each month for programming. These programs and services are completely free for all youth who wish to attend.



# INCLUSIVITY + COMMUNITY

According to The Trevor Project, LGBTQ+ young people who reported living in very accepting communities attempted suicide at less than half the rate of those who reported living in very unaccepting communities.

Outreach opportunities are unique experiences to connect with youth, families, and community partners who may benefit from the programs and services we provide. We connect to:

- Local community at Farmer's Markets and cultural, sporting and recreational events.
- Businesses via free educational training and
- Chambers of Commerce and other not-for-profits via networking.

Our community partnerships allow LGTBQ+ youth and allies to enjoy experiences together in safe and welcoming spaces outside of the ALSO Youth Centers.

We depend on our critical volunteer base to achieve these connections. There is a place for everyone to help!



#### **OUR EXPENSES**




We take our fiduciary responsibility seriously and act with integrity and transparency for both the community we serve and our generous donors.

The majority of our expenses continue to be spent on Programs that have a direct impact on the ALSO Youth community and empower them for the future.

As our cultural climate changes, so do the needs of our youth. From 2023 to 2024, the number of requests for mental health counseling has increased by 7%. Additionally, our overhead costs have increased steadily over the last three decades.



#### **OUR FUNDING**



Since 2020, our budget has almost doubled due to population growth and increased demand for services to LGBTQ+ youth. Fortunately, our remarkably generous donor base continues to grow and evolve in support of our mission.

Our primary source of income are Individuals and Grants (total 70%), but events and investment returns from our Reserves contribute 16% and are an important part of our community connections and sustainable future.

In 2025+, we wish to further develop our community of sponsors, with a special initiative to partner with more businesses. This directly fulfills our mission to create more inclusive communities.



#### CHALLENGES

In 2023,

of LGBTQ+ youth considered attempting suicide.

In Florida in 2022,

74%

of LGBTQ+ youth faced discrimination for their gender identiy/sexual orientation.

In 2023, less than

40%

of LGBTQ+ youth found their homes to be LGBTQ affirming.

of LGBTQ+ youth wanted mental health counseling, but could not access it.

Our future is dictated by the needs of the LGBTQ+ youth in our community, and with the help of our donors, community partners, volunteers, and tireless staff, we will continue to respond to these needs thoughtfully.



Key initiatives for 2024-2025 include:

#### **Evolve Programming for New Engagement**

Each generation has different interests and want changes. We plan to add and expand events to bring LGBTQ+ youth the most relevant and impactful programs to support their well being and development.

Increase Number of Volunteers, Committee Members and Board Reps With over 100 volunteers including 10 board members and 20 committee members, we are always mobilizing more to join us in support of our mission. The passion and energy that our volunteers bring to our organization is invaluable.

#### **Enhance our Presence in the Community**

Our youth centers are the heart of our mission, and we are exploring means to be even more present in the community wherever we can share our



message and support all LGBTQ+ youth. We aim to be recognized as THE Community Leader for LGBTQ+ Youth. Please help us get there!
