



New World Screwworm Update

The Idaho Cattle Association (ICA) is aware of the detection of New World Screwworm in Texas and New Mexico. Though this issue is ongoing, it is important to note that food safety is not a concern.

The Idaho State Department of Agriculture (ISDA) has released updated guidelines on cattle imports into our state. Most notably, *all animals entering Idaho from an infested state require a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within 5 days of movement*. ICA is monitoring the situation, and will defer to the ISDA for guidance as the situation progresses.
