# THE IRRIGATION METER


A SOLUTION TO BLOATING WATER BILLS



Many Houston homeowners have felt the strain of high-water bills caused by the city's continued increase of water rates over the last few years. The rate increases combined with the region's sweltering temperatures have Houstonians seeking innovative ways to trim those bloated water bills. The good news is there is a solution that can put you on the path to substantial savings – installing a dedicated irrigation meter.

A typical city water bill has four main components: base water charge, base sewer charge, consumption water charge, and consumption sewer charge. The base water and base sewer

charges are fixed fees designed to cover the cost of maintaining infrastructure, regardless of how much water is used. Most homeowners are focused on the consumption water charge and consumption sewer charge when evaluating their monthly bill. The consumption water charge reflects the actual amount of water used during the billing period, while the consumption sewer charge is the cost of treating the water that goes down the drain into the city sewer system.




#### SEASONAL SPOTLIGHT: THE IRRIGATION METER

What the city or water provider does not readily disclose is irrigation water, which constitutes a significant portion of a home's water consumption, does not flow into the city sewer system. Instead, it is absorbed into the soil. As a result, many cities, including Houston, offer homeowners the option to install a dedicated irrigation meter that is exempt from the base sewer and consumption sewer charges. For countless homeowners in the Houston area, this presents an excellent opportunity to significantly reduce their water bills, particularly during the warmer months when irrigation systems work overtime.

Once the installation is complete, the homeowner will receive a separate monthly bill for the water that passes through the irrigation meter. This water will not be subject to the base sewer and consumption sewer charges. While this will not reduce overall water consumption, it can lead to a significant reduction in monthly water bill. Additionally, it provides an accurate assessment of your irrigation system's monthly water usage.
