The Butte County Fair Was originally incorporated in September, 1973, as the Paradise Apple Festival and Fair. It was organized to promote agriculture, mining, livestock, horticulture, and other fairs and expositions. In 1948 the fair moved to its present location on East Hazel Street and has remained one of the state's truly rural fairs, still reflecting its original purpose - to carry on agriculture exhibitions.


