Course Description

This online self-paced course is designed to provide students with a structured and flexible way to complete bail bond education. The course is divided into ten sections that cover the legal, ethical, procedural, and operational aspects of bail bond practice.

Each section includes:

- Lesson content
- Guided reading
- An assignment
- A quiz

Students complete the course independently, but they must progress through the sections in order.

Course Progression Policy

This is a mastery-based course.

To move from one section to the next, each student must:

1. Complete the lesson materials
2. Submit the section assignment
3. Earn a minimum score of 70% on the section quiz

A student who scores below 70% on a quiz must retake the quiz before advancing.

Final Exam Policy

The final exam is proctored.

Students must:

- Schedule a date and time for the final exam
- Take the exam live in front of a camera
- Complete the exam in an approved proctored setting, such as Zoom, Google Meet, or another approved video platform

The student must remain visible on camera for the duration of the exam.

 6. Analyze underwriting decisions and bond-writing practices

 8. Explain forfeiture, judgment, and remission procedures

 10. Identify criminal, administrative, and regulatory violations affecting bail bond agents

Discussion Board Requirements

As part of this online self-paced course, students are required to participate in discussion board activities designed to strengthen understanding of bail bond law, court procedure, public safety, and the professional responsibilities of bail bond agents.

Purpose of Discussions

Discussion assignments give students the opportunity to:

- strengthen critical thinking and communication skills

Discussion Requirements

Students must complete all assigned discussion activities in the course.

For each discussion, students must:

1. submit one main discussion post

Main Post Requirements

Each main post must:

- clearly answer the discussion question
- demonstrate understanding of the assigned lesson
- include thoughtful explanation and analysis
- be written in complete sentences
- be at least one well-developed paragraph

Reply Requirements

Each student must respond to at least two classmates. Replies should:

- be respectful and professional
- add meaningful substance to the discussion
- include agreement or disagreement with explanation
- add another legal point, example, or perspective
- ask a thoughtful follow-up question when appropriate

Replies such as “**I agree**” or “**Good post**” without further explanation will not receive full credit.

Discussion Topics

Discussion topics may include:

- the role of bail bond agents in court compliance
- public safety and accountability
- arrest and pretrial release
- judicial discretion in bail decisions
- regulation and ethics in the bail bond profession

Grading

Discussion participation may be included as part of the student's overall course grade. Students are expected to complete all discussions as assigned.

Assignment

Assignment 1:

In this assignment, students will examine the legal and regulatory framework governing Bail Bond Agents in Florida. Students will identify the state department responsible for licensing and regulation, the elected official who leads that department, the Florida Statutes and Administrative Code that apply to bail bond practice, and the different types of criminal defendant's bonds. Students will also explain the purpose, obligation, and methods of fulfillment for each bond type. This assignment is designed to strengthen students' understanding of the laws, rules, and responsibilities that form the foundation of bail bond practice.

Assignment 2:

In this assignment, students will identify and explain the licensing requirements for bail bond applicants in Florida, with specific focus on age, residence, education, and character. The

purpose of this assignment is to help students understand the basic qualifications required for licensure and the professional standards expected of individuals entering the bail bond industry.

Assignment 3:

In this assignment, students will examine the basic legal principles of fraud and contract law as they apply to bail bond practice. Students will identify the five elements of fraud, the five elements of a valid contract, and the legal status of contracts based on enforceability. Students will also define important legal terms related to fraud, misrepresentation, concealment, waiver, perjury, and void or voidable agreements. This assignment is designed to strengthen students' understanding of contract validity and legal defenses that may affect bail bond transactions.

Assignment 4:

In this assignment, students will review the department requirements and legal standards that apply to the operation of a bail bond agency. Students will examine office requirements, recordkeeping, reporting obligations, annual registration, restrictions on soliciting business, and employee criminal history rules. Students will also define agency, explain the purposes of the two types of powers of attorney, list the steps in the bail bond agent's biennial registration process, and distinguish between actual and apparent authority. This assignment is designed to strengthen students' understanding of agency operations, compliance duties, and professional authority in bail bond practice.

In this assignment, students will examine the basic procedures surrounding bail setting, approval, and release in criminal cases. Students will identify the officials who ordinarily set, accept, and approve bail, explain when bail is considered appropriate, define a warrant, and describe the court proceeding where bail is usually set. Students will also review the common methods by

which a defendant may be released. This assignment is designed to strengthen students' understanding of the early stages of the bail process and the legal roles involved.

Assignment 6:

In this assignment, students will examine the rules governing premium handling, surrender of a defendant, and the documents required after a bond is posted. Students will identify when premium must be returned, when a defendant may be surrendered without return of premium, the essential elements of a valid bail bond, the current premium rate, and the information required on a premium receipt. Students will also review what additional consideration may be accepted and the documents that must be provided to the defendant. This assignment is designed to strengthen students' understanding of bond execution, financial compliance, and required disclosures in bail bond practice.

Assignment 7:

In this assignment, students will examine the structure and jurisdiction of the Florida court system and its role in bail bond practice. Students will identify the four Florida courts and their jurisdictions, explain the components of original jurisdiction, and recognize which courts hear appeals. Students will also define key legal terms such as *nolle prosequi* and *no information*, explain how a bail bond agent may authorize the arrest of a defendant by law enforcement, and identify the court proceedings in which a defendant's guilt or innocence may be determined. This assignment is designed to strengthen students' understanding of court procedure, jurisdiction, and the bail bond agent's role within the judicial process.

Assignment 8:

In this assignment, students will examine the legal procedures and consequences related to bond forfeiture, judgment, and arrest authority after forfeiture. Students will identify the reasons a forfeiture may be discharged within 60 days, explain what happens when a forfeiture is not paid or discharged, and describe the consequences of unpaid judgments. Students will also identify who may lawfully arrest a defendant, what forfeiture information must be reported to the department and when, and when a bail bond agent loses arrest powers over a defendant after forfeiture. This assignment is designed to strengthen students' understanding of forfeiture procedures, reporting duties, and post-forfeiture enforcement authority in bail bond practice.

Assignment 9:

In this assignment, students will examine the rules and procedures governing collateral in bail bond practice. Students will identify the types of acceptable collateral for bonds over \$50,000, explain in whose name collateral must be accepted, and describe how collateral must be held. Students will also review the requirements for returning collateral after fulfillment, outline the steps for converting collateral, and list the information that must be included on a collateral receipt. This assignment is designed to strengthen students'

understanding of collateral handling, documentation, and compliance responsibilities in bail bond practice.

Assignment 10: Regulatory Violations Analysis

In this assignment, students will examine the disciplinary authority of the Department of Financial Services over licensed bail bond agents. Students will identify the types of disciplinary actions that may be imposed against a licensee who is found guilty in a departmental proceeding. This assignment is designed to strengthen students' understanding of regulatory enforcement, professional accountability, and the consequences of violations in bail bond practice.

Final Exam

Proctored Final Examination

After completing all ten sections, assignments, and quizzes, the student becomes eligible for the final exam.

Final Exam Requirements

- Must be **scheduled in advance**
- Must be taken on an approved date and time
- Must be taken **live in front of a camera**
- Student must remain visible throughout the exam
- Student may be required to verify identity before beginning
- No final exam will be administered without scheduled proctor approval

Final Exam Format

- Comprehensive exam covering all ten sections
- Multiple-choice, true/false, and application-based questions
- Timed exam administered in a proctored setting

Passing Requirements

To successfully complete the course, the student must:
