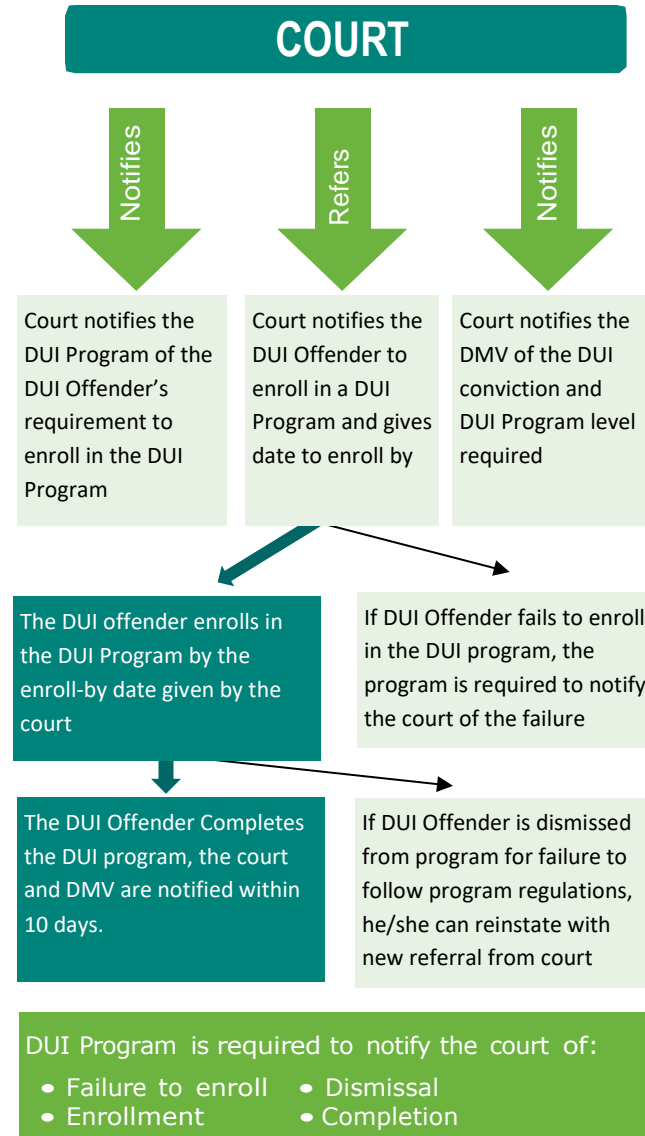

Enrollment/Reinstatement

For your enrollment appointment, bring the following:

1. Court Referral, or Court Docket and DMV H-6 Form, or Admin Per Se
2. Down payment (Check with the program you choose, for the down payment amount)
3. Plan to be at your appointment for 2 hours.
4. No Drug or Alcohol use 24 hours prior to your appointment.

Immediately contact one of the agencies listed to schedule an enrollment appointment.

Failure to enroll within 30 days of your court appearance AND failure to successfully complete your DUI program may result in a warrant for your arrest. Additional penalties may impact your driving privileges.

STATE LICENSED DUI PROGRAMS

The Alameda County Driving Under the Influence Programs are here to assist you in completing your court-ordered and DMV requirements and help reduce future DUI's. We will:

- Help explore the relationship with alcohol and/or drugs and understanding of the inherent risks involved.
- Promote modified drinking/drug use in high-risk situations, such as driving under the influence.
- Provide counseling and education to reduce the likelihood of a repeat DUI offense.
- Proactively help with alcohol and/or drug problems to make life affirming choices.

WHAT TO EXPECT

State Licensed Driving Under the Influence programs provide education, group counseling and individual case management, and an individual substance use assessment.

The goal of the DUI Program is to encourage your exploration of the relationship between alcohol/ drug use and the inherent risks involved, resulting in modified drinking/drug use in high-risk situations such as driving.

Program length is based upon Blood Alcohol Content (BAC) and Vehicle Code prior DUI Convictions.

- 12-Hour Education Only – Vehicle code 23103 with a BAC under .08%. Vehicle code 23140 under 21 years when arrested.
- 3-Month First Offender – Vehicle code 23152 with a BAC .08% - .15%
- 6-Month First Offender – Vehicle code 23152 with a BAC .15% - .19%
- 9-Month First Offender – Vehicle code 23152 with a BAC .20% or greater
- 18-Month Multiple Offender – Vehicle code 23152 more than one DUI Conviction within 10 Years.

ENROLLMENT

The purpose of the enrollment session is to explain the DUI program requirements, complete your enrollment paperwork, and help you choose your schedule of program activities. There is a fee for your program.

Court Referral Enrollment

At the enrollment session you will need to provide your court probation order paperwork.

DMV Referral Enrollment

If you are no longer under the supervision of the court or Probation Officer, and want to enroll into a DUI program, you must obtain a DMV Driving Record, which can be requested online or at your local DMV office

DMV Admin Per Se Referral

For First Offenders Only

Did you know that you may be eligible for a restricted license if you sign up for a DUI program?

The DUI Program will accept the Admin Per Se form (generally a pink temporary driver's license provided at arrest) if you would like to enroll in a DUI program prior to your court appearance.

DUI Program Fees

The cost of your DUI program is determined by which length of program the court or DMV requires.

There is a down payment required at the time of your enrollment appointment. If you need financial assistance, please inquire with the selected DUI program.
