**LAW 14** 

PENALTY KICK

- A penalty kick is awarded against a team that commits one of the ten offences for which a direct free kick is awarded, inside its own penalty area and while the ball is in play
- PENAL OFFENCES kicks or attempts, trips or attempts, jumps, charges, strikes or attempts, pushes, tackles, holds, spits, deliberately handles ball.

- A goal may be scored directly from a penalty kick.
- Additional time is allowed for a penalty kick to be taken at the end of each half or at the end of periods of extra time.

## PENALTY KICK Position of the Ball and Players

- The ball:
- must be placed on the penalty mark
- The player taking the penalty kick:
- must be properly identified
- The defending goalkeeper:
- -must remain on his goal line, facing the kicker, between the goalposts until the ball has been kicked
- The players other than the kicker must be located:
- 1. inside the field of play
- 2. outside the penalty area
- 3. behind the penalty mark
- 4. at 9.15m (10 yards) from the penalty mark

## PENALTY KICK POSITIONING OFFICIALS



### PENALTY KICK ASSISTANT REFEREE POSITION

- Stands at the intersection of the penalty area and the goal line
- Monitors infringements by the goalkeeper
- Signals if a goal has been properly scored
- Returns quickly to the touchline if the ball remains in play

#### **PROCEDURE**

- After the players have taken positions in accordance with this Law, the referee signals for the penalty kick to be taken
- The player taking the penalty kick must kick the ball forward
- He must not play the ball again until it has touched another player
- The ball is in play when it is kicked and moves forward

Lets look at Clip 1


 Feinting as a player approaches the ball is permissible.

- Lets look at Clip 2
- As this player approaches ball the non kicking foot is planted
- The player does not kick the ball (feints)
- Causes the goalie to move then the player kicks the ball
- This is NOT PERMISSABLE

- Feinting in the run-up to take a penalty kick to confuse opponents is permitted as part of football. However, feinting to kick the ball once the player has completed his run-up is considered an infringement of Law 14 and an act of unsporting behaviour for which the player must be cautioned
- FIFA interpretation of the law

- When a penalty kick is taken during the normal course of play, or time has been extended at halftime or full time to allow a penalty kick to be taken or retaken, a goal is awarded if, before passing between the goalposts and under the crossbar:
  - the ball touches either or both of the goalposts and/or the crossbar and/or the goalkeeper
- The referee decides when a penalty kick has been completed

- If, after the penalty kick has been taken, the kicker touches the ball again (except with his hands) before it has touched another player:
- an indirect free kick is awarded to the opposing team, the kick to be taken from where the infringement occurred

- Lets look at a few clips and I want you to make the call
- Clip 3
- Decision :
- Infringement by the defending team
- Ball entered the goal net
- GOAL

- Clip 4
- Decision:
- Infringement by both teams
- Ball enters the goal net
- RETAKE the penalty kick

- Clip 5
- Decision
- Player taking the kick, kicks the ball forward
- Player from the attacking team (teammate)
   runs forward and kicks ball into the goal net
- GOOD GOAL

- Kicks from the penalty mark are not part of the match
- It is a method of determining the winner of a match that is tied after regulation time and (if used) extra time.

- PROCEDURE
- Referee chooses the goal at which the kicks will be taken
- Referee tosses a coin and the team whose captain wins the coin toss decides whether to take the 1st or the 2<sup>nd</sup> kick
- Referee keeps a record of the kicks being taken (AR at centre circle should be keeping record)

- Both teams take 5 kicks subject to certain conditions
- Kicks are taken alternately by the teams
- If both teams have taken 5 kicks, one has scored more goals than the other could score, even if it were to complete its 5 kicks, no more kicks are to be taken

- If, after both teams have taken 5 kicks, both have scored the same number of goals, or have not scored any goals. Kicks continue to be taken in the same order until 1 team has scored a goal more than the other from the same number of kicks.
- Once all eligible players have taken a kick from the penalty mark, the same sequence does not have to be followed as in the 1<sup>st</sup> round of kicks.

- Each team is responsible for selecting the players from those that are on the field of play at the end of the match and the order in which they will take the kicks
- Each kick is taken by a different player and all eligible players must take a kick before any player can take a 2<sup>nd</sup> kick
- Only eligible players and match officials are permitted to remain on the field of play when kicks are being taken

# KICKS FROM THE PENALTY MARK Players and Match Officials Position



- All players, except the player taking the kick and the 2 goalkeepers, must remain within the centre circle (make exception for age and level)
- The goalkeeper not involved in the kicks must remain on the field of play, outside the penalty area, on the goal line

- A goalkeeper who is injured while kicks are being taken from the penalty mark and unable to continue as a goalkeeper may be replaced by a named substitute (subject to maximum number of substitutes allowed)
- Only players who are on the field of play at the end of the match, which includes extra time where appropriate, are allowed to take kicks from the penalty mark

- A player other than the goalkeeper who is injured may not be substituted during the taking of the kicks
- An eligible player may change places with the goalkeeper at any time when kicks are being taken IF THE REFEREE IS NOTIFIED
- If the goalkeeper is sent off during the taking of the kicks, he/she shall be replaced by a player who finished the match

- A player, substituted player or substitute may be cautioned or sent off during the taking of the kicks
- The referee shall not stop the match if a team has less than 7 players during the taking of the kicks

### KICKS FROM THE PENALTY MARK Positioning of Officials and Goalkeepers



- When a team finishes the match with a greater number of players than their opponents, they shall reduce their numbers to equal with that of their opponents and inform the referee of the name and number of each player excluded
- The team captain has this responsibility

 Before the start of the kicks the referee shall ensure that only an equal number of players from each team remain with the centre circle and they shall take the kicks



 If a player is injured or sent off during the taking of kicks and the team has 1 less player, the referee SHOULD NOT reduce the number of players from each team as this is required only at the start of the kicks

- Decision
- The taking of the kick was not complete just because goalkeeper made the save
- GOAL

Clip 7

- Decision
- The taking of the kick was not complete just because the ball hit the crossbar
- GOAL

Clip 8

- Decision
- Goalkeeper moved off the goal line before the ball was kick kicked
- Goalkeeper saved the ball
- Retake the kick

Clip 9

- Decision
- Goalkeeper moved off the goal line before the ball was kick kicked
- Goalkeeper saved the ball
- Retake the kick
