LAW 12 Fouls and Misconducts

- The following are penal offences:
 - Spits at an opponent
 - Kicks or attempts to kick an opponent
 - Trips or attempts to trip an opponent
 - Jumps at an opponent
 - Charges an opponent
 - Strikes or attempts to strike an opponent
 - Holds an opponent
 - Pushes an opponent
 - Handles the ball deliberately (except GK in penalty area)
 - Tackles an opponent to gain possession of the ball making contact with the opponent before touching the ball

LAW 12 Fouls and Misconducts

- “Careless” means that the player has shown a lack of attention or consideration when making a challenge or that he acted without precaution.
- • No further disciplinary sanction is needed if a foul is judged to be careless
- “Reckless” means that the player has acted with complete disregard to the
- danger to, or consequences for, his opponent.
- • A player who plays in a reckless manner must be cautioned
- “Using excessive force” means that the player has far exceeded the necessary
- use of force and is in danger of injuring his opponent.
- • A player who uses excessive force must be sent off

Law 12 Fouls and Misconducts

- The following are technical offences:
 - Plays in a dangerous manner
 - Impedes the progress of an opponent
 - Prevents the GK from releasing the ball from his hands
 - Commits any other offence not mentioned in Law 12
- Goalkeeper offences inside penalty area:
 - Controls the ball with his hands for more than 6 secs
 - Touches the ball again with his hands after he has released it and before it is touched by another player
 - Touches the ball with his hands after he has received it directly from a throw in
 - Touches the ball with his hands after it has been deliberately kicked to him by a teammate

Law 12 Sanctions

- Cautionable offences for players:
 - Unsporting Behaviour – Reckless
 - Dissent by word or action
 - Persistent infringement of the LOTG
 - Delaying the restart of play
 - Failure to respect the required distance
 - Entering or re-entering without referees permission
 - Deliberately leaving the field of play without referees permission

Law 12 Sanctions

- Cautionable offences for substitutes/substituted players:
 - Unsporting behaviour
 - Dissent by word or action
 - Delaying the restart of play

Law 12 Sanctions

- The following are sending off offences for players, substitutes and substituted players:
 - Serious foul play – Against an opponent, who is playing the ball while it is in play – dangerous manner
 - Violent conduct- Against anyone, anytime, anywhere
 - Spitting at an opponent or any other person
 - DOGSO by deliberately handling the ball
 - DOGSO by committing an offence against opponent punishable by a free kick or penalty kick
 - Using offensive, insulting or abusive language and/or gestures
 - Receiving a second caution in the same match

- Reckless more than just careless
- Yellow card to #15
- Restart is a direct free kick to Germany
- Men's USA vs Germany

- Infringement by # 10 Germany
- Not allowing the Algerian goalie to release the ball
- Indirect free kick Algeria
- Can you caution # 10?
- Men's Germany vs Algeria

VIDEO REVIEW CLIP 5

- Germany #16 makes a fair challenge on the ball
- Touches the ball before making contact with # 6 Brazil
- No Offence
- Restart – corner kick
- Men's Brazil vs Germany

VIDEO REVIEW CLIP 6

- #11 Netherlands has an Obvious Goal Scoring Opportunity
- He is fouled by #3 Brazil to deny the opportunity
- #3 Brazil is shown the Red Card and sent off
- Restart – The offence occurred outside the penalty area. Free kick Netherlands
- *Referee made 2 errors on this decision*
- Men's Netherlands vs Brazil

VIDEO REVIEW CLIP 7

- #4 Black makes a challenge on #15 Blue who is playing the ball
- #4 Black challenges in a dangerous manner
- #4 Black is shown the red card and sent off
- Restart – Direct free kick for Blue
