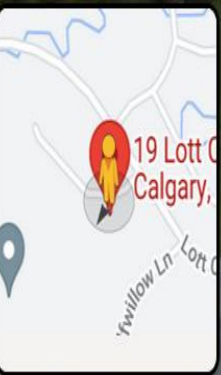

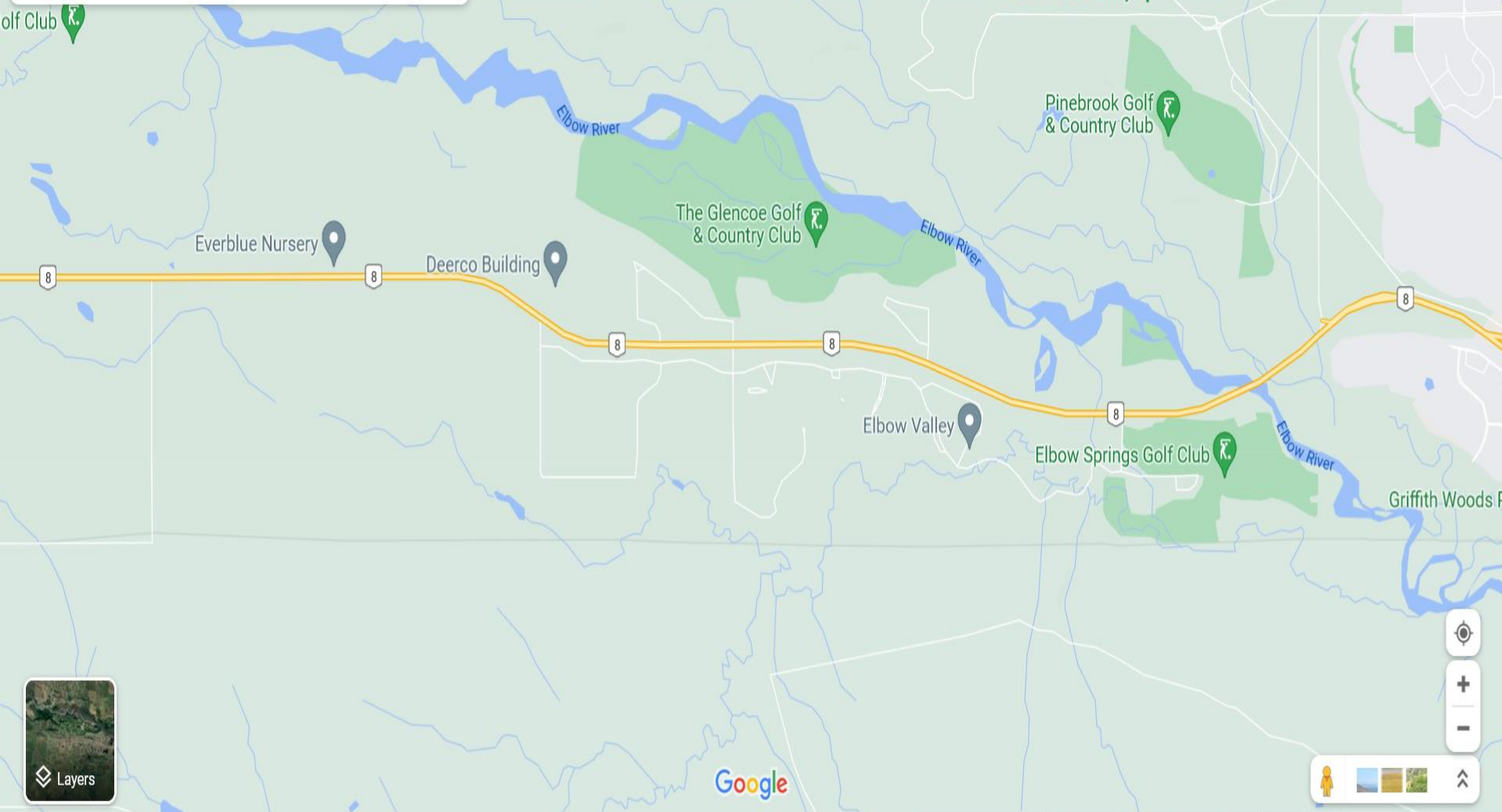

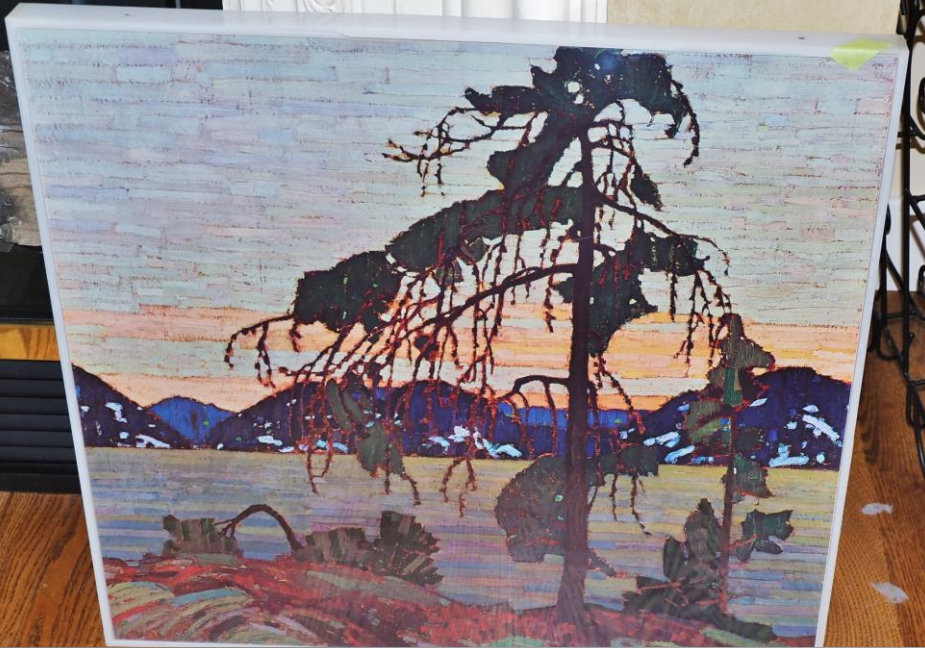

JACQUES DE TONNANCOUR (1917 -)

Jacques de Tonnancour was born in Montreal and studied at the Ecole des Beaux-Arts there and at the school of the Art Association of Montreal.

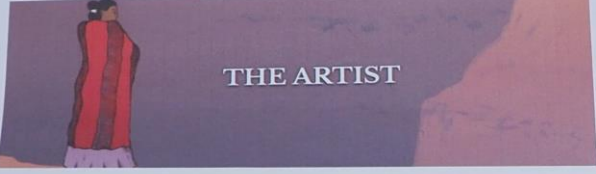
His early landscapes in sombre greens and blacks owe a considerable debt to his teacher, Goodridge Roberts, but from the start they have had an energy which contrasts with the lassitude of Roberts. His fine, sure draughtsmanship, from which all unessentials are eliminated, is illustrated in the many figure paintings which he did in the 1940's.

Though de Tonnancour has never studied long in France, the impact of the giants of French painting has been felt in Montreal and it shows in de Tonnancour's work. In fact, so great was his obsession with Matisse and Picasso that, as he freely confesses, he had to stop painting landscapes for a time to treat himself. It was during a year spent in Brazil in the 1940's on a Brazilian government scholarship that the beauty of the landscape made such a strong impression on him that he found himself confronted with the problem of finding his own personal method of abstracting the essential elements from nature.

In recent years the Montreal artist has been concerned with the conscious deformation of shapes and outlines in still lifes and figures. By forceful arrangements in design, he hopes to be able to invest his compositions with a "feeling of timelessness".
