Led by BGC East Scarborough, the Yemoja Village Affordable Housing Initiative is at the forefront of addressing the urgent need for affordable housing in East Scarborough. This area faces significant housing challenges, and our initiative stands as a beacon of hope, providing a solution to the national shortage of over 3.5 million housing units projected by 2030.

#### YEMOJA VILLAGE PROJECT

Situated at 62 Orchard Park Drive, Scarborough, the Yemoja Village Affordable Housing Initiative addresses the declining affordability of housing. Our aim is to provide equitable housing solutions for marginalized communities, with construction set to commence in 2025. This project is a crucial step towards community development and empowerment, standing adjacent to the MAAT (Mentoring Academic Arts Technology) Youth Innovation & Cultural Centre. This centre serves as a hub where youth aged 13-29 can explore their creativity and potential.


#### STATEMENT FROM JOHN MCKAY, MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT, SCARBOROUGH GUILDWOOD

#### **BE BOUNDLESS - 2023 GHANA DELEGATION JOURNEY**

In 2023, our BE BOUNDLESS Ambassadors, which included 2 members of our Board of Directors, embarked on a life-changing cultural exchange to Ghana as special guests to celebrate the Silver Jubilee Emancipation Day, and attend the land presentation for the first Boys and Girls Club of Ghana Community site in the Assin Achiase region, inspired by our Youth Leadership Exchanges in 2019 and 2022. Be Boundless Emerging Leadership Exchanges have allowed 42 youth, staff, and members from our community to explore, directly learn, and immerse in their history, culture, and identity, fostering a deeper understanding of their heritage and the world around them. Our staff engaged in train the trainer style workshops with local artists, traditional crafts professionals, and historians to support the development of the organization's culturally focused programs and services.









#### TRIP HIGHLIGHTS

#### **ASSIN ACHAISE REGION**

Participation in traditional enstoolment ceremonies where our CEO and delegation were honoured for their commitment to supporting the animation and development of a local Boys & Girls Club, which would model some of BGCES's programs and services for the local children and youth in Ghana.

#### **MONKEY VILLAGE**

Learning about local conservation efforts and tourism promotion.

#### **TOGO AND BENIN**

Visits to the Songhai Centre, a leading environmental and sustainability project, and the sacred Voodoo Temple and Python Temple in Kpasse.

#### **GHANA**

Tours of Kakum National Park, Cape Coast Castle, Assin Masso Slave River, W.E.B. DeBois house, and the Kwame Nkrumah Mausoleum.

#### **IMPACT**

The trip was challenging, emotional, inspiring, informative, and eye-opening. New friendships emerged, and the experiences led to unique discussions about life, music, economic development, health, and identity.

In 2023, in addition to our historical programs and services, Yemoja Village Affordable Housing Initiative and BE BOUNDLESS Leadership Exchange clearly exemplify our commitment to empowering our community, fostering a sense of unity, and addressing critical issues like affordable housing and cultural understanding. ## EARLY YEARS SERVICES

Early Years Services offers inclusive programs, and integrated early childhood services, which are designed for children from birth to six years old. Through participation in these programs, parents and caregivers have the opportunity to connect with each other while gaining access to a wide range of resources, including highly motivated and qualified staff, and other professionals in their community. These resources support parents in their role as their child's primary educator and caregiver.

#### Highlights

The Reading Partnership for Parents program was offered virtually on Tuesday evenings. There was a very high demand for this program, and based on the numbers it seems to be growing in popularity.

The Early Years Enrichment program was offered in the spring and fall. Families enrolled their child for 10 weeks of experiences that focused on getting them ready for school.

Summer Camp for 4-year-old children was delivered in July and August exposing them to a wide variety of learning experiences, and engaging excursions into the community.

### SUCCESS STORIES



#### EARLY YEARS ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

An hour after opening registration for our Early Years Enrichment Program it was filled. Eight families signed up and a waitlist was put in place for the next session.

The ten-week program saw participants experiencing a structured, stimulating environment that fostered independence. The activities were engaging with a strong focus on school readiness. Math, science, and phonics were explored, a nutritious lunch provided, and opportunities for outdoor play was a part of the daily schedule.

Parents received verbal reports on a weekly basis, and a mid and end of term progress report was also shared with the families. Parents had scheduled time to discuss their child's progress.

#### TRIP TO RIVERDALE FARM

On July 14th the families at our Corvette site went on a trip to Riverdale Farm. For many of them this was their first time experiencing an off-site excursion through the program, riding on a school bus, and going to a farm. There were 45 participants with a total of 17 families in attendance.

This was an amazing opportunity for families to spend time interacting with each other while out in the community. Everyone appreciated the fact that, post-COVID, they were now able to safely participate in excursions into the community, and beyond. These trips offered great opportunities for children's enhanced learning and social emotional development.



#### Highlights


In November, the National Day of The Child was celebrated across the department. Educators were reminded of their promise to treat each child with dignity and respect. Through our programs, we can ensure that children occupy spaces where they have the opportunity to have their voices heard.

There were several opportunities for community, and parent engagement in the form of celebrations, including; The Terry Fox Run, National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, Granny and Me, outdoor picnics with families, and a few fundraising events for The Hospital for Sick Children, and United Way. Parents participated in programs by coming in to share cultural artifacts, reading to the children, tending the garden with the toddlers, hosting a tea party, and teaching the children a cultural dance.

Throughout the year, team building and training for staff was prioritized. There were events held after work hours, and a one-day conference that incorporated fun activities and learning for the team.

## Licensed Childcare Services

In our programs, knowledgeable and responsive educators ensure the healthy social, emotional, and intellectual development of children from birth to 12 years old. Our planned curriculum supports the full participation of all children. The environment provides opportunities for learning through active engagement, observations, experimentation, and social interactions. Parent involvement is celebrated, and we are intentional in the way that we engage with the communities that we serve, being aware of and respecting their uniqueness.



## SUCCESS SEORIES and Our Impact





"We know Emma is so well looked after under the centre's care. It is a safe space where she is loved. It is evident when she looks forward to going (most) mornings and when she doesn't want to leave at pickup. Educators and children in the preschool room at East Scarborough Childcare Centre, along with the coaches from Little Kickers Scarborough, embarked on a professional learning community experience. They all came together to explore a shared interest and passion for soccer to engage in the process of collective and collaborative learning.

Through participation in this exercise, the children built knowledge of soccer skills, along with social skills, cooperation, and gross motor development including coordination while using their feet to kick and dribble the soccer balls. The educators were co-learners in this experience since they were taught similar skills by the coaches.

By the end of the sessions, this group had grown relationships, and learned together as they were guided by the soccer coaches. This experience encouraged the staff to look for other ways to establish professional learning communities by partnering with organizations that offer services that benefited and enhanced the learning and development of the staff and children in our programs.

In commemoration of Remembrance Day, the children and educators in the school age program chose to honour the Veterans residing in the Chartwell Guildwood Retirement Home. This home has been in our community for many years and is familiar to some of the children that live in the neighbourhood.

After several lessons, and research on the significance of Remembrance Day, the children decided to visit the Veterans and present them with cards and a poster. The school agers designed and created the cards and poster; and arrangements were made for them to deliver the items to the Chartwell Residence. Due to the COVID restrictions that were still in place, the children could not have direct contact with the residents.

However, their token of appreciation was well received by the employees and displayed in the lobby for everyone to experience. The children were extremely proud of the work that was done for this project.

## Children and Early Teen Services

The programs in Children & Early Teen Services are planned to work towards achieving our established learning outcomes by promoting personal and group growth. With our funders' support we are able to deliver focused and well-designed outcome-oriented programs that develop the child, in a safe, accessible, and fun way. Group leaders utilize HIGH FIVE principles to plan activities that promote physical, cognitive, language, social, and emotional growth and development.

#### Highlights

House of Hockey presented by Tim Hortons in partnership with MLSE was launched. Toronto Maple Leafs and partners Justin Bieber, his brand Drew House, and Tim Horton's created an accessible and inclusive ball hockey league, delivered at the Club, which breaks down traditional barriers that youth face when trying to participate in hockey, such as cost, ability to skate, and extensive equipment.

#### YOUTH SCHOOL SUCCESS INITATIVE



Gabby is a focused and determined individual who prioritizes her academics receiving A's in every subject. Our main objective for students in YSSI is to help improve their grades, learn new skills, and prepare them for high school. Gabby was a student who always took the initiative in completing assignments and had high expectations for herself.

Gabby was recognized by her teachers and peers as a top-class athlete in her school participating in various sports teams such as basketball, volleyball, track & field, flag football, and ultimate frisbee. She enjoyed playing each of these sports, but her passion was track & field as she was considered to be the fastest in her school, competing for regionals in 100m, 200m and 400m relay.

Although Gabby lives in a tough neighbourhood with her Mother and younger sister, she remained committed and persistent in achieving her goals, not allowing adversity to hinder her future. At our YSSI showcase last year, Gabby won a Tech Scholarship Award receiving a laptop, headphones, and school supplies to help her transition into high school. In addition, she also received the 'Star of the Year Award' for being the best all-around student/individual in our program. Gabby has a bright future ahead of her, and with the incredible attributes and traits she possesses, she will continue to flourish and accomplish anything she puts her mind to.

#### GALLOWAY BREAKFAST & AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

Avery joined our Breakfast and Afterschool Program in early 2023. In the beginning of her time with us, she had issues regulating her emotions. She was not making connections with her peers and did not trust her staff. Through the consistency of her staff, she began to open up. First it was only with a few members of our team, but it then grew to more and more of her program leaders. We now have minimal issues with her behaviour and she is more open to participating in program. Avery has created friendships that she carries with her into the school day. She has joined the sports programming that we offer in the evenings and attends PA Day and Summer Camp programs. We are so proud of her progress and cannot wait to see what 2024 has in store for Avery.



# Youth & Community Outreach Services

The MAAT Youth Innovation & Cultural Centre emerged from BGC East Scarborough's visionary Chief Executive Officer, backed by unanimous Board support. Focused on empowering Black, Indigenous, People of Colour communities, this centre provides a safe haven for youth aged 13-29 to explore creativity, integrate academics, career, family, and social life, fostering personal development and positive community impact.

Saturday Inclusion Programs include Circle of Friends, a sensorimotor gym program, and Connecting with Friends, a social skill building program. All of these programs embrace the principles of inclusion to support the success of children and their families.


Inclusion Facilitator created a new Connecting with Friends program to support social skill development for children, 4-12 years old, with extra support needs.


## Strategic Partnerships & Resource Development


