President & Executive Director Report

As we reflect upon the many activities of the past twelve months, it is with great pleasure that we present the 2016 Annual Report. The year was filled with much excitement and promise as the Club got off to a terrific start when it was selected as one of 4 communities across Toronto to receive funding to lead the Healthy Kids Community Challenge. The Challenge will target children from birth -12 years old as evidence suggests that targeting this age range may lead to a better outcome, as these years are critical for establishing healthy behaviours. The Challenge will also target parents/families and service providers and bring together partners from a variety of sectors such as public health, education, recreation and the local business sector, to work together to promote healthy behaviours in children now and into their future.

Educational attainment has been a top priority here at the Club, we are of the belief that by supporting children and youth to overcome barriers they can achieve their full potential. This year has been no exception as we continued to focus on our Stay-In-School programs including Rogers Raising the Grade, a partnership with Rogers Communications. As a result we saw the participation in these programs rise to 95 children and youth. Our expectations have been far surpassed and we thank our dedicated staff and the many committed mentors of these programs who help to make learning fun!

We are now half way through our Strategic Plan and we are delighted to report that we have published the first edition of the Club's Program and Services Guide from which families can choose programs and register their children online. To raise funds and promote the work of the Club we launched the Scarborough Food Truck Festival at which over 6000 people attended. We are grateful for the support of our partners and sponsors; University of Toronto Scarborough Campus, Scarborough Twilight Rotary Club, CIBC Mellon and Sharp Electronics.


At our last AGM the Board of Directors recommended amendments to its by-laws, these new amendments reflect the many new programs and services now offered by the Club. These proposed changes came about as a result of the Province of Ontario introducing Bill 85 the Act to amend the Ontario Not-for-Profit Corporations Act (ONCA). One of the key elements of the Act is that corporations are permitted to have either an open membership corporation or a closed membership corporation. A closed membership corporation means that directors become the members of the corporation, and an open membership corporation means that the membership of the corporation is broader than the directors. Last year at the AGM the Board of Directors discussed this matter and put before the membership a recommendation "that the Club move to be incorporated as a closed membership corporation". This was approved by the members with the understanding that the Club will continue to seek input and consult its members as well as the community as it has always done. We are excited to report that the Board of Directors has completed the review of its by-laws and is well on the way to completing this

In closing, we are pleased to report that the Club successfully completed the BGCC National Peer Review. This process provided the Club with an opportunity to demonstrate that it is achieving, excelling or advancing toward a set of comprehensive quality standards which all Clubs are expected to meet.

With the implementation of full day kindergarten, our programs experienced a slight decrease in children between the ages of 4 – 6 years, however the 2 – 4 age group increased.




